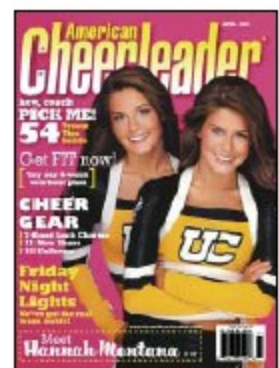


### Around New Territory
